A Level Religious Studies: Philosophy and Ethics with Buddhism

Philosophy: Studying the great Philosophers like Plato, Aristotle, Swinburne and Hick.

Ethics: Situation Ethics, Virtue Theory, Natural Law and other ethical theories. These will be applied to things like nuclear warfare, polyamorous relationships and Euthanasia.

Buddhism: Students will study the beliefs, teachings and practices of Buddhism.

They will debate whether Buddhism is a more relatable religion for modern society with the increase in the use of mindfulness.
